

## The Loom of Hope (FRATERNITY)

#### THE LOOM

Marie Poussepin wove her project, her community.

She recognized, in the midst of her mission, that the Church is a living loom where each person contributes a unique thread. Walking together, listening, and engaging in dialogue is weaving hope in community. Even though the threads differ in color and texture, the Spirit intertwines them into one single fabric: the Kingdom of God, born of fraternity.

Amid different paths, Marie Poussepin chose a simple and common way. On her return to Dourdan, she passed through a small village called Sainville. At that moment, she decided to begin preparing the threads that would lead her to fulfill God's project within her.

#### PREPARING THE THREADS


Just as the weaver prepares each strand before beginning, God calls us to prepare our hearts to walk together. Marie Poussepin prepared herself, placing her life in God's hands... Hope in her began with availability.

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# "Hope That Becomes a Journey... (PATH – THE POOR)"

Day 2



"Listen, my beloved brothers: Did not God choose those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom that he promised to those who love him?"

James 2:5

For a fabric not to come apart, the threads of the loom must be well tightened. In the same way, hope is strengthened when we anchor it in the smallest and in the poor. They remind us of what is essential: that life is not sustained by abundance, but by trust and solidarity. To walk synodally means allowing ourselves to be taught by those who, even in their poverty, continue to believe and to hope. Their resilience is a strong thread that holds together the weave of the community. To tighten the loom is to let our hearts be stretched toward them, so that hope may become a shared journey.


This path was already begun by our foundress, Marie Poussepin—from that little girl who carried bread and clothing, who served in her parish, and who offered to care for a sick elderly woman. From the beginning, she fixed her gaze on those in need of her service, recalling her own words: "You will do all that charity can inspire." That is why today her legacy lives on, still inspiring millions of children, young people, lay persons, and consecrated women and men throughout the world.

The lives of the saints are like a fabric of vibrant colors that God continues to weave throughout history. Marie Poussepin dedicated her life to the education and care of the little ones, planting in them hope and a future. Her vision recognized in every child a seed of God and in every young person a call to transform society.

Pier Giorgio Frassati lived his youth with enthusiasm, faith, and joy, reminding us that holiness is not sadness but a path "toward the heights." Carlo Acutis, through his love for the Eucharist and his creativity in the digital world, showed that it is possible to be holy in everyday life, even using modern tools to evangelize.

All three—Marie, Pier Giorgio, and Carlo—are threads of hope that beautify the fabric of the Church. They invite us to discover our own color and place it at the service of God and others.


#### **CHOOSING THE COLORS**

## Impacting Paths of Hope (Missionary Expansion)

Marie Poussepin teaches us that mission is not only about reaching new places but about opening the heart to sow faith, service, and fraternity in every concrete reality. From Dourdan and Sainville, she allowed the Gospel to inspire her actions: caring for the sick, educating children, and forming communities capable of living in fraternity. Today, as we look at history, we see how her vision became missionary expansion: her spiritual daughters have spread across many countries, bringing health, education, and evangelization. Wherever they go, the Dominican Sisters of Charity of the Presentation continue the work of their foundress, building paths of hope in schools, hospitals, neighborhoods, and forgotten towns.

Marie Poussepin passed on to her community this deep conviction, encouraging it to keep alive the presence of God in all its actions, to find holiness in work, and to trust fully in divine guidance.


The challenge today is to keep this spirit of trust and surrender alive, responding faithfully to her vocation and allowing the presence of God to be the guiding thread of our lives and actions.

Her work of charity, born from her experience of God, reminds us that even in the deepest pain, love can be the balm that heals and transforms. She teaches us that faith is not an escape, but an active response to the tears of the poor and the excluded. Today, when entire peoples suffer forced exile, when women, children, and the elderly cry out for justice, and when the very earth groans from being exploited without measure, the legacy of Marie Poussepin inspires us not to remain silent in the face of suffering. Her spirit encourages us to build bridges where there are walls, to restore the dignity of every person, and to sow hope where despair seems to prevail.

The charism she left is a force that transcends borders and times, a dynamism that continues to ignite hearts willing to serve. In the face of humanity's desolation, she invites us to be signs of peace, to transform charity into concrete action, and to boldly proclaim that God's providential love is stronger than any pain.



# Courage Has the Face of Hope (The Social Context of Young People)





"How can a young person keep their way pure? By living according to your word." Psalm 119:9

In every fabric, there are always mistakes or knots that seem to spoil the weave. Yet the weaver does not get discouraged: with patience, they correct, adjust, and continue. In the same way, in the midst of a world wounded by injustice, violence, and lack of opportunities, young people are courageous because they do not give up. They are capable of transforming the flaws of the social fabric into new possibilities—raising their voices, dreaming of a different future, and acting with creativity. Their courage is the face of hope: they teach us that even in the midst of twisted threads, it is always possible to begin again, to resume the weaving of life with greater strength and more vibrant color. A synodal Church recognizes this youthful protagonism and offers them the space to be artisans of a tomorrow filled with hope.

"Never lose the courage to dream and to live boldly! Embrace the culture of care and spread it; be champions of fraternity; face life's challenges by allowing yourselves to be guided by God's faithful creativity and by wise counselors."


Marie Poussepin insists to the sisters: "Bring young people the knowledge of Jesus Christ and his mysteries, and enkindle every heart, if possible, with his love" (R. XXVII). She chooses to live and communicate especially with the young who need her help, her counsel, and her formation. She knows the importance of forming their consciences, understanding that through this they will come to live out the project of holiness.

### Connecting with Faith, Hope, and Love

1 Corinthians 13:13

Marie Poussepin was a weaver, not only of wool, but also of life, community, and service. On her loom, the firmest threads were faith, hope, and love. Faith was the thread that gave her strength to trust in God even in the midst of difficulties.

Hope was the thread that encouraged her to keep weaving, with the certainty that the future could be better.

Love was the thread that gave unity, beauty, and meaning to the fabric of her entire work.

So it is with our own lives: when we live in faith, hope, and love, God weaves together every moment, every struggle, and every act of service until our story becomes a beautiful work that reflects His presence. Today, as young people of Marie Poussepin, we are called to be living fabrics: with faith that sustains, with hope that drives us forward, and with love that unites. For only then will the fabric of our lives show the patience, unity, and beauty of God's project.

The finished work of a fabric reflects patience and unity: every stitch is necessary, every color has its place, every thread is intertwined with another to form a harmonious whole.

### The Hope that Sings with Mary





"My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for the Mighty One has done great things for me." (Luke 1:46-47, 49)

As we begin this last day of our novena, we start by contemplating the loom of life. Every thread we have woven during these days—each prayer, each gesture, each commitment—was never meant to remain hidden in silence. A fabric fulfills its mission when it is offered, when it serves.

Marie Poussepin, a woman of faith and profound vision, discovered that the Christian life is a song of hope. Like Mary, she was not overcome by the difficulties of her time, but trusted in God's providence and in the strength that comes from serving others.

Hope is that inner melody that sustains the heart in the midst of uncertainty. Mary sang it in her Magnificat, proclaiming the greatness of a God who casts down the powerful and lifts up the humble. Following that same echo, Marie Poussepin wove a work of mercy and charity that was not kept within her personal loom, but offered as a service to the poorest and most in need.


